That's what we'll explore in this session: How do we get students writing more, and how do we give them the kind of instruction and feedback they need to write better, without driving ourselves crazy in the process?

Dave Stuart Jr. teaches high schoolers in a small town and writes and researches about literacy instruction, character strengths, and the inner work of teaching. He speaks about his work through keynotes and workshops at conferences and school-based events around the USA, and more than 35,000 people read his articles each month.
